One of my students slowed down to shout at me "You lied to us, Mrs. Stein! We don't need our coats!" I still shake my head at the memory. Now the student was teasing in her allegation, and it was received in the manner in which it was delivered, but I had a thought. Words matter. What we say and how we say it holds power in the behavior of others. I had a talk with the student about precision of language, and choosing words carefully. How often do we use careless words? Words that are meant to tease, change behavior, or play that end up hurting inadvertently? Proverbs 13:3 tells us to choose our words carefully to avoid destruction. This is a lesson we have been learning in school, and one that is near to my heart.
